Consolidated Report for Slow learners and Advanced learners

The institute caters to all its students irrespective of class, race or religion. However, as the student moves up in professional years, the formative and summative assessments help faculty grade them.

The regular formative assessment helps the faculty to identify the slow achievers. These slow achievers are provided constant support by the respective departments to help them learn at their own pace. The internal assessment improvement test provides another chance to these students in upgrading their marks. For supplementary batch remedial measures like extra classes, group study with advanced learners; academic and personal counselling, bilingual explanation for slow learners are carried out

Special programs like mentorship are available for slow learners. On a feasible ratio, students are assigned to faculty members who monitor their progress, keep contact with their parents/guardians, and counsel them from time to time. Such students are also facilitated with online /extra classes if they need.

The morale of advanced learners is boosted by felicitating them with awards every year. Advance learners may also avail various grants and exchange programs with national and international institutions with whom KGMU has MOUs. These are competitive and are based on academic progress records and extra-curricular participation.

Seminars, conferences, workshops, inter collegiate competitions and student felicitations are also organized by various departments.

Minutes of the Meeting

Minutes of the meeting held on 27th July 2021 at 11:00AM in the office of the Dean, Academics (PHI Building) to analyse the academic journey, voids and gaps of each of the failing students and suggest recommendation for their future continuity, if deemed appropriate:-

The following were present:-

The members of the committee analysed the voids and gaps of each of the failing students and it was found that:-

- a) Approximately 13 students have been absent from the university for a long time after getting admission in MBBS First Professional. 02 Students whose attendance remained irregular for many years were not allowed to appear in the examination.
- b) There are 04 students who appeared in MBBS 1st Professional Examination and did not clear even in 09 to 20 attempts. As per the record available in Students Section (UG/PG Section) and Examination Section of this University, out of these 04 students, 02 students are failing in all the subjects of MBBS 1st Profeseesional, 01 student in Biochemistry & Physiology and 01 student in Anatomy & Physiology.
- c) In MBBS IInd Professional, there is 01 student who did not pass in 10 attempts & 01 student didn't fill the examination form.
- d) In the MBBS Final Professional Part-I, 03 students are failing continuously and 05 students are not filling their examination form.
- e) In the Final Professional Part-II, many students are not filling their examination form and 08 students are failing inspite of 06 to 22 attempts.

After analysing the records, the committee decided the following:-

- In 2019, National Medical Commission, New Delhi has issued a gazette notification dated 04.11.2019 stating therein the total duration of completion of MBBS course and maximum number of permissible attempts from 2019 batch and afterwards, which is as follows:-
 - 7.6 (ii) "A learner shall not be entitiled to graduate later than ten (10) years of her/his joining the first MBBS course"

Point no. 2 of 11.2.7(a):-

"A maximum number of four permissible attempts would be available to clear the first Professional University examination, whereby the first Professional course will have to be cleared within 4 years of admission to the said course. Partial attendance at any University examination shall be counted as an availed attempt". No such rule on the above matter exists for the students admitted earlier than 2019.

2. The committee observed the rules prevailing in Lucknow University, Ordinances and Regulation (1984-85) related to the above matter which are as follows: "Candidates who fail to appear in or to pass the First-Professional Examination in five successive opportunities shall not be allowed to continue their studies except

with special permission of the Faculty"

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Due to luck of rules related to the above in the National Medical Commission, New Delhi & King George's Medical University Act & Statutes, the committee feels that the above rules of Lucknow University may be adopted for all Professional Examinations of MBBS course.

3. The MBBS students have to complete their course in a period of Ten (10) years.

4. However those students who have taken admission before ten (10) year, for them, it is recommended they may be given a maximum number of two (2) mercy attempts to clear the examination.

 Those students who have taken admission but are not attending their classes and are not filling their examination form, should be notified on their contact details available in the office records.

6. The committee suggests that well structured remedial classes shall be arranged for the students who have been failing and each candidate will be specially monitored by the respective Head of the Department.
