QS ranking

- 50 % score is for factual parameters (Faculty, Research and International Research

Network). Rest 50 % for Academic and Employer perception

- For perception, QS has a huge database generated for survey
- Ranking preparations should be done annually with consistency

- When we introspect why very few universities make place in top positions of world

rankings, there are several reasons:

1. Citations are mostly done for publications from the west, who don't vote us for

our increased perception.

2. There is less international collaboration in publications

3. International Collaboration in publications is focused for few high repute

universities of the West, others from Asia or other parts of the world are ignored.

(This is called International Research Network)

- 4. We don't give votes to our own State Universities
- 5. We don't collaborate with Universities from underdeveloped countries
- 6. There is limited reach to our alumni for placement and perception

Session 2:

NAAC parameters shall change (within 6 months) from Input based to Outcomes based

New parameters shall focus on

- Outcome based education

- Alignment of curriculum with SDGs of NEP

- Binary grading in individual programs rather than regular grading score




Figure 1. Schematic representation of fluorescein dye stained parathyroid glan identification using mobile camera fitted with filter.

Administrative Set Up

• The Chancellor, the Vice-Chancellor, and the members of the executive council, the Court and the Academic Council for the time being holding office as such in the University shall constitute a body corporate by the name of [King George's Medical University, Uttar Pradesh]





Administrative Set up

The Chancellor - The Governor, Head of the university and the President of the Court and shall when present, preside at meetings of the Court, and at any convocation of the university.

The Vice-Chancellor - whole-time salaried officer of the University and shall be appointed by the chancellor, from amongst the persons whose names are submitted to him by the Committee constituted in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (2) of KGMU Act 2002.

The Pro-Vice-Chancellor - shall assist the Vice-Chancellor in respect of such matters as may be specified by the Vice-Chancellor on this behalf from time to time and shall preside over the meetings of the University in absence of the Vice-Chancellor and shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be assigned or delegated to him by the Vice-Chancellor.



Administrative Set up

- The Finance Officer shall be responsible for presenting the budget (annual estimates) and the statement of account to the executive Council and also for drawing and disbursing funds on behalf of the University.
- The Registrar shall be responsible for the due custody of the records and the common seal of the University. Exofficio Secretary of the Executive Council and shall be bound to place before the Executive Council all such information as may be necessary for the transaction of its business. Perform such other duties as may be prescribed or required from time to time, by the Executive Council or the Vice-Chancellor.
- The Controller of Examination shall be responsible for the due custody of the records pertaining to his work. He shall be **ex-officio Secretary of the Examination Committee of the University** and shall be bound to place before such committee all such information as may be necessary for the transaction of its business.

Appointment and Conditions of Service of Teachers and Officers

Appointment teachers

^{at} ^{of} 35. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Act, the teachers shall be appointed by the Executive Council on the recommendation of a Selection Committee in the manner hereinafter provided. The selection committee shall meet as often as necessary.

(2) The appointment of every such teacher not being an appointment under sub-section (3) shall in the first instance be on probation for one year which may be extended by the Executive Council for a period not exceeding one year:

Provided that no order of termination of service during or on the expiry of the period of probation shall be passed in the case of a teacher of the University, except by the order of the Executive Council made after considering the report of

Minutes of the meeting held on 27th July 2021 at 11:00AM in the office of the Dean, Academics (PHI Building) to analyse the academic journey, voids and gaps of each of the failing students and suggest recommendation for their future continuity, if deemed appropriate:-

The members of the committee analysed the voids and gaps of each of the failing students and it was found that:-

- a) Approximately 13 students have been absent from the university for a long time after getting admission in MBBS First Professional. 02 Students whose attendance remained irregular for many years were not allowed to appear in the examination.
- b) There are 04 students who appeared in MBBS 1st Professional Examination and did not clear even in 09 to 20 attempts. As per the record available in Students Section (UG/PG Section) and Examination Section of this University, out of these 04 students, 02 students are failing in all the subjects of MBBS 1st Professional, 01 student in Biochemistry & Physiology and 01 student in Anatomy & Physiology.
- c) In MBBS IInd Professional, there is 01 student who did not pass in 10 attempts & 01

Consolidated Report for Slow learners and Advanced learners

The institute caters to all its students irrespective of class, race or religion. However, as the student moves up in professional years, the formative and summative assessments help faculty grade them.

The regular formative assessment helps the faculty to identify the slow achievers. These slow achievers are provided constant support by the respective departments to help them learn at their own pace. The internal assessment improvement test provides another chance to these students in upgrading their marks. For supplementary batch remedial measures like extra classes, group study with advanced learners; academic and personal counselling, bilingual explanation for slow learners are carried out

Special programs like mentorship are available for slow learners. On a feasible ratio, students are assigned to faculty members who monitor their progress, keep contact with their parents/guardians, and counsel them from time to time. Such students are also facilitated with online /extra classes if they need.

The morale of advanced learners is boosted by felicitating them with awards every year. Advance learners may also avail various grants and exchange programs with national and international institutions with whom KGMU has MOUs. These are competitive and are based on academic progress records and extra-curricular participation.



Best Practice in Curricular Aspects was discussed by Dr. G. Padmavathy, Dean of Academics on Multidisciplinary Approach to Curriculum Development

Best Practice in the domain of Teaching-Learning and Evaluation T"echnology Enriched Teaching-Learning" was shared by Process Dr. K. Arockia Maraichelvi, Associate Professor, Human Development.

Best Practice – Research, Innovations, and Extension Quality Enhancement through R&D and Community Innovation among Students by Dr. P. Lalitha, Dean, Research and Development, AVINUTY

The presentation highlighted the University's R&D policy planning towards alignment of NEP 2020. It highlighted that through this policy they are moving towards Atma Nirbha r Bharat vision of NEP 2020. They had formulated guidelines for research keeping this vision in mind. Besides, work shop and hanholding for faculty nad students is done to promote research. They focus on collaborative research projects and mentoring consortium. Students reaserch is vetted through havea stringent quality check and they train the students for the same with adequate infrastructure to so so. They also presented a video of DR CNR Rao research centre with state of the art armamentarium. Yearly research convention is organized to showcase nad motivate research environment in the University. They are registered with KAPILA portal for facilitation of Patents. They also showed a video on pavers brick which is thgeir patented technology. They are also generating revenue through consultancy and are implementing incentive based capacity building. An example of facebook post was shown. Thaey have e campus software to document reaserch.

A unique Gurudaksham program from donation by a superannuated faculty has promoted reaserch grants for students. The presentation was ended by the adage" we rise by lifting others".

Best Practice – Infrastructure and Learning Resources A Model, Modern Learning Management System Dr. P. Subhashini, Professor, Computer Science, AVINUTY

The presenation showed that the University possess basic knowledge and relative tools for learning. They have their own cloud centre which provides unlimited storage for faculty nad students and also act as a service provider. The presentation focused on the in house development of LMS for teaching learning purpose. In 2019 they got a grant from DST which helped them in development of the LMS. Initially the sensitization was done through google classrooms during Covid time. Then they moved to E campus Moodle and in third stage developed in house LMS which is functional in 2022. The future plans are to develop an open source LMS platform.



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Best Practice – Student Support and Progression Dedicated Student's Counseling and Psychological Support Centre Dr. Sudha, Asst. Professor, Psychology, AVINUTY

Dedicated student counseling and psychological support center was presented by Dr. Sudha from the Department of Psychology who highlighted that the department since its inception has been providing counseling services and now does it as a Center for Ambitious and Resourceful Endeavors (C.A.R.E) where they enhance the mental health and well-being of students along with skill based and holistic development. The center offers Psychometric assessment and interventions to staff and students in form of behavior therapy to make them emotionally independent. Peer counseling is advocated. An important aspect of career guidance and building is aptitude testing of all final students. The University has developed and validated a CARE Intervention module and CARE Assessment module which encompasses compassion, achieving a purposeful life, relationship building and enhancing positive emotions.

Best Practice – Governance, Leadership, and Management Academic and Administrative Audit as a tool for Institutional Quality Enhancement, Dr. U. Jerinabi, Coordinator, IQAC, AVINUTY

Dr Jerinabi explained that the adoption of academic and administrative audits helped the institute in gaining better ranking and accreditation. She emphasised that AAA helps to understand and assesses strengths and weaknesses of departments and administrative units. It helps in identifying bottlenecks and gaps, better management of resources and their mobilization. At their institute the audits are aligned with quality markers set by accreditation council.

Best Practice – Institutional Values and Best Practices Inculcation of Value Based Education & Life Skills Dr. K. Ramya, Asst. Professor, Business Administration, AVINUTY

The Institute distinctiveness was discussed by Dr. Ramiya, Institutional values and best practices: Inculcation of Value based Education and Life skills. The vision of the institution was highlighted as it is a women university imparting value system to women while helping them in selfdevelopment and empowerment. The approach is to sensitize students to positive values and inculcate them in a class by engaging students in practicing positive values and attitudes by acting on imbibed values. The community service and other extension services help students develop positive values and attitudes both in and outside the class room. They also offer a community based value system by active participation. Through these extracurricular activities and daily routines the value education is addressed for all domains of learning. Bonding between Institution and Alumni is also cultivated. Bioethics in the form of specific domain based values like consumer ethics, research ethics is done in the regular courses and in the value added courses through
