Minutes of the Meeting of Board of Faculty of Medicine held on 08th May 2025 at 02:00PM in the Brown Hall, Administrative Block of this University.

At the outset, *Prof. Amita Jain*, Chairperson and Dean-Academics, warmly welcomed all the esteemed members of the Board of Faculty of Medicine, KGMU, Lucknow.

She apprised the members that the primary agenda items pertain mainly to:

- Introduction of PDCC/Fellowship courses,
- Value Added Courses, and
- Revision of curricula across various academic programs.

1. Communication from National Medical Commission (NMC):-

In reference to the above, Prof. Jain informed the house that the **National Medical Commission, New Delhi**, via its letter No. N-P016(20)/1/2024-PGMEB-NMC dated 20-12-2024, has stated that:-

No medical college/institute shall run any PG medical qualification (including PDCC, PDF, etc.) without the prior approval of the Commission. Non-compliance may attract action under the provisions of Section 9.1 and 9.2 of the Post Graduate Medical Education Regulations-2023, and Section 8(1) and 8(2) of the Maintenance of Standards of Medical Education Regulations-2023.

Accordingly, the Office of the Dean-Academics has submitted a formal communication to NMC seeking further directions, after the approval from Hon'ble Vice Chancellor regarding continuation of these 62 PDCC/Fellowship courses already running in the University. However, a response from NMC is still awaited.

2. Approval of Guidelines for Value Added Courses:-

Prof. Anjoo Agarwal was requested to present the proposed **Rules and Regulations for Value Added Courses**. She presented the draft guidelines before the members.

After due deliberation, the house unanimously **approved the guidelines** for the Value Added Course.

A copy of the approved guidelines is enclosed herewith for reference.

Thereafter the Board of Faculty of Medicine took up the agenda for deliberation and the following resolutions were made:-

The issue related to the rotation of second internal examiners was also found **not to be under the jurisdiction of the Board of Faculty of Medicine**. It was resolved that the Head, Department of Neurology, may refer the matter to the relevant University authority for necessary action.

Guidelines on Value-Added Courses (VACs)

Preamble

With emerging trends in technical and professional education emphasizing the need for value addition beyond the standard curriculum, higher education institutions must take proactive steps to equip students with industry-relevant skills. As industries evolve and new technologies emerge, the University recognizes the importance of supplementing traditional curricula with focused, short-term courses. Value-Added Courses (VACs) are introduced to enhance student employability, foster individual aptitudes, and meet the requirements of accreditation bodies such as NAAC.

1. Definition and Purpose

Value-Added Courses (VACs) are specialized programs designed to enhance the knowledge, skills, and employability of students beyond their standard curriculum. These courses aim to provide additional qualifications and training across various interdisciplinary and emerging fields.

Note: VACs are **not mandatory** to qualify for any academic program.

Objectives of VACs

- a) Bridge skill gaps and enhance employability.
 - b) Foster interdisciplinary learning among students.
 - c) Encourage entrepreneurial thinking and promote job creators over job seekers.
-

2. Designing and Approval Process

- a) Course design should be based on inputs from employers, alumni, and industry experts to ensure relevance and alignment with skill gaps.

b) VACs must be distinct from any core course or electives already offered in the regular curriculum of the respective or other programs within the University.

c) Any faculty member/department intending to initiate a VAC must seek approval from:

- The Departmental Board Meeting
- The Board of Studies of the respective Deanery & Academic Council.

d) Each VAC shall be assigned a **unique course code**, allotted by Dean Academics after course approval

3. Duration

a) Each VAC should be of **at least 16 hours**, with a **preferred duration of 30 hours or more**.

b) Delivery may be **staggered over days or weeks**, and conducted in **offline, online, or hybrid mode**. Can be conducted during weekends or vacations too in an online mode for few hours. Majority of course should be in a classroom engagement mode.

4. Course Curriculum & Registration (Annexure D)

a) Coordinators must prepare a **course brochure** including:

- Intake capacity and eligibility criteria
- Course objectives and expected outcomes
- Name of course coordinator/faculty
- Module overview
- Assessment method(s)
- Recommended reading/resources

b) Students may enroll in **only 2 VACs per academic year**, and Participation in at least **one VAC is recommended** during the academic program. Enrollment is on a **first-come, first-served basis**.

- c) The University website shall host an updated list of VACs and syllabi.
- d) Registration is to be completed via a duly filled VAC registration form to be given by the department conducting the course

- d) The course must specify its target audience, but students from other departments may register with the course coordinator's approval.

- e) These courses can be kept open for Candidates from other institutes too, but this should be mentioned while seeking approval.

- f) Minimum number of students can be according to the course (minimum 5-10), but keeping in mind that the resources (faculty time and infrastructure) are not spent on a very small batch of students.

5. Course Faculty

- a) Course coordination shall preferably be undertaken by faculty from KGMU. One course coordinator to be assigned for the course by the department. Course coordinator will be responsible for scheduling, attendance, assignments, assessments and record-keeping of the course.

 - b) External experts may be invited as resource persons, based on course requirements and with necessary approvals from Dean academics and Hon'ble Vice Chancellor.
-

6. Course Venue

The Coordinator/Head of department shall arrange necessary classrooms, labs, or online facilities for the smooth conduct of the VAC. It can be conducted at the Kalam Centre, with a venue fee waiver, subject to approval by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor.

7. Fee Structure

A **nominal fee** may be charged from participants to cover costs related to **logistics, certificates, and refreshments**. (A recommendation regarding a minimal fee to Post-graduate and PhD students and no fee for undergraduates was made in the Academic Council, subject to approval)

8. Assessment and Certification

- a) An **assessment** shall be conducted at the end of each course.

- b) **E-certificates** will be issued to students who successfully complete the course, bearing the **signatures of authorized signatories**

- c) **Minimum passing criteria** (marks/grades) should be clearly mentioned in the course brochure.

Students Feedback and Recommendations for future improvement must be taken from the students and submitted to dean office.

9. Credit Allocation

VACs shall be eligible for **credit allocation** as per following guidelines.

- **1 credit** may be awarded for every **16 hours** of academic engagement (lecture/practical/discussion), though they will **not contribute to the final marks/CGPA** of the core program. Credits will be reflected on the certificates
-

10. Documentation and Reporting (Annexure II)

The following must be maintained by the course coordinator:

- **Attendance records** (signed by students)

- **List of enrolled and passing students**

Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for Identification and Support of Slow Learners.

Identification and support of slow learners is essential to encourage these students and ensure their academic progress.

Standard Operating Procedure (SOP's) for identification and support of Advanced Learners

Identification and support of advanced learners is essential to motivate these students and ensure their rapid academic progress through exploring their skills and potential. The university encourages advanced learners in several ways.

1. **Creation of a reward system for academic excellence and imparting awareness regarding medals:** The university has a reward system for excellence in learning through a plethora of medals and certificates for academic achievements in individual subjects as well as for overall performance. Students are made aware of these medals and the process for their award, during the induction course, held when they first join college, expecting that this will encourage competitive advanced learners to focus on their goal of achieving academic excellence.
2. **Identification of advanced learners by departments/university**
 - I. Students faring extremely well in formative and summative assessments, that is obtaining 75% or more of allotted marks in theory or 80% practicals /clinics or students who win medals in one or more subjects
 - II. Repeatedly do extremely well in seminars and other student activities in the department
 - III. Students who come forward to participate in research and academic activities beyond the regular scheduled activitiesStudents who fulfill at least two of the above criteria will be considered advanced learners and offered additional support.
Information regarding these students will be communicated to Dean office
3. **Supportive measures for advanced learners**
 - I. Counseling sessions will be held from time to time with advanced learners to explore their ambitions and goals by designated faculty of the department.
 - II. Identified students will be encouraged to apply for intramural and extramural research grants
 - III. Additional learning resources, including access to experts within and outside the university, reference books and materials will be provided on request of the student
 - IV. Additional tutoring classes on advanced topics will be provided to advanced learners on request.
 - V. If student wishes to explore learning opportunities for academics or research outside the university, encouragement will be provided by the university in the form of permissions. Financial support, will be provided, where possible, as permitted by extant rules.

Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for Value-Added Courses (VACs)

King George's Medical University

Preamble

With emerging trends in technical and professional education emphasizing the need for value addition beyond the standard curriculum, higher education institutions must take proactive steps to equip students with industry-relevant skills. As industries evolve and new technologies emerge, the University recognizes the importance of supplementing traditional curricula with focused, short-term courses. Value-Added Courses (VACs) are introduced to enhance student employability, foster individual aptitudes, and meet the requirements of accreditation bodies such as NAAC.

1. Definition and Purpose

Value-Added Courses (VACs) are specialized programs designed to enhance the knowledge, skills, and employability of students beyond their standard curriculum. These courses aim to provide additional qualifications and training across various interdisciplinary and emerging fields.

Note: VACs are not mandatory to qualify for any academic program.

Objectives of VACs

- Bridge skill gaps and enhance employability.
- Foster interdisciplinary learning among students.
- Encourage entrepreneurial thinking and promote job creators over job seekers.

2. Designing and Approval Process

- Course design should be based on inputs from employers, alumni, and industry experts to ensure relevance and alignment with skill gaps.
- Any faculty member/department intending to initiate a VAC must seek approval from:
 - The Departmental Board Meeting
 - The Board of Studies of the respective Deanery & Academic Council.
- VACs must be distinct from any course already offered in the regular curriculum of the respective or other programs within the University.
- Each VAC shall be assigned a unique course code.



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3. Duration

- Each VAC should be of at least 16 hours, with a preferred duration of 30 hours or more.
- Delivery may be staggered over days or weeks, and conducted in offline, online, or hybrid mode.

4. Course Curriculum & Registration

a) Coordinators must prepare a course brochure including:

- Intake capacity and eligibility criteria
- Course objectives and expected outcomes
- Module overview
- Assessment method(s)
- Recommended reading/resources

- Students may enroll in only 2 VACs per semester.
- The University website shall host an updated list of VACs and syllabi.
- Registration is to be completed via a duly filled VAC registration form.

5. Course Faculty

- Course coordination shall preferably be undertaken by faculty from KGMU.
- External experts may be invited as resource persons, based on course requirements and with necessary approvals from Dean academics and Hon'ble Vice Chancellor.

6. Course Venue

Courses meeting the prescribed VAC criteria may be conducted at the Kalam Centre, with a venue fee waiver, subject to approval by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor or they can be conducted in the host department.

7. Fee Structure

A nominal fee may be charged from participants to cover costs related to logistics, certificates, and refreshments, subject to approval.

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8. Assessment and Certification

- a) An assessment shall be conducted at the end of each course.
- b) E-certificates will be issued to students who successfully complete the course, bearing the signatures of authorized signatories.
- c) Minimum passing criteria (marks/grades) should be clearly mentioned in the course brochure.

9. Credit Allocation

VACs shall be eligible for credit allocation as per following guidelines.

- 1 credit may be awarded for every 16 hours of academic engagement (lecture/practical/discussion), though they will not contribute to the final marks/CGPA of the core program.

10. Documentation and Reporting

The following must be maintained by the course coordinator:

- Attendance records (signed by students)
- List of enrolled and passing students
- Course brochure and materials
- Geo-tagged photographs of sessions/events. This documentation must be submitted to the Office of the respective Deanery, Dean Academics, and Dean Quality & Planning for institutional records and NAAC compliance.
